

# ADVERB / ADJECTIVE (good or well, careful or carefully, etc.)

## Adjectives Modify Nouns

- Adjectives are placed directly before a noun:

### Examples:

*Tom is an **excellent** singer.*

*I bought a **comfortable** chair.*

*She's thinking about buying a **new** house.*

- Adjectives are also used in simple sentences with the verb 'to be'. In this case, the adjective describes the subject of the sentence:

### Examples:

*Jack is **happy**.*

*Peter was very **tired**.*

*Mary'll be **excited** when you tell her.*

## Adverbs

### Adverbs Modify Verbs, Adjectives and Other Adverbs

- Adverbs are easily recognized because they end in '-ly' (with a few exceptions!):

### Examples:

*Adjective - **careful** / Adverb - **carefully***

*Adjective - **quick** / Adverb - **quickly***

- Adverbs are often used at the end of a sentence to modify the verb:

### Examples:

*Jack drove **carelessly**.*

*Tom played the match **intelligently**.*

*Jason talks about his classes **constantly**.*
